The Birmingham City Council (Off-street Parking Places) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1990 Part III (Inner City)

The charge shall not apply to the holders of badges issued to registered disabled people or to invalid carriages or vehicles issued to disabled persons in lieu of an invalid carriage.

The hours of operation will be 0800 hours to 1800 hours Monday to Saturday, Christmas Day and Bank Holidays free.

The parking spaces will be available for the following classes of vehicles:

Motor Cycles, Motor Cars and Invalid Carriages as defined in section 136 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and motor vehicles constructed or adapted solely for the purpose of carrying goods but not exceeding 30 cwt. unladen weight.

BRADFORD METROPOLITAN COUNCIL

Bradford Metropolitan Council (Traffic Regulation) (No. 1) Order 1990

BRENTWOOD DISTRICT COUNCIL

The District of Brentwood (Ongar Road and Nine Ashes Road, Stondon Massey) (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Brentwood District Council hereby give notice that acting in pursuance of arrangements with the Essex County Council made under the Local Government Act 1972 they have made an Order under section 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the following lengths of road:

(1) *Ongar Road*, Stondon Massey, from a point 260 metres south-east of the junction with Nine Ashes Road northwards for a distance of 575 metres.

(2) *Nine Ashes Road*, Stondon Massey, from the junction with Ongar Road northwards for a distance of 290 metres.
