Permanent Prohibition of Driving on Camp Hill Road, C307, Highgate Common, Enville

Notice is hereby given that Staffordshire County Council propose to make a Traffic Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which will make permanent the provisions of the experimental Prohibition of Driving Order which prevents you from driving any motor vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on every Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holiday along Camp Hill Road, C307, Highgate Common, Enville from a point 139 metres south-east of its junction with Highgate Road in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 215 metres to a point approximately 95 metres north-west of its junction with Highgate Common Road North.

Exceptions are made in the Order to allow the entry of vehicles into the road for the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, electricity, water, telephones and sewerage services.

This Order will be called the Staffordshire County Council (Camp Hill Road, C307, Highgate Common, Enville) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1990.

Full details are in the Order which together with a map showing the restricted areas and a statement of the County Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during normal office hours at my office and during normal opening hours at the Wombourne Branch Library, Windmill Bank, Wombourne.

Suffolk County Council (Parish of Long Melford) (St. Catherine's Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that on 24th April Suffolk County Council made the above Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit waiting as specified in the Schedule to this notice. There are also the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles.

The original notice of intention relating to these proposals appeared in the *London Gazette* on 25th July 1989 (Ref. 321). The effect of the Order as made is as in that notice.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any of the requirements of that Act or any Instrument made under it have not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Suffolk hereby gives notice that it has made, and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 for authorising the Council:

(a) to stop up:

C737 Hollow Road;

Bridleway I (Fornham St. Martin) from a point 45 metres west of the disused railway eastwards for a length of 100 metres;

Al34 from its junction with the B1106 Culford Road by Flint Cottages north-eastwards for a length of 480 metres;

B1106 from a point 15 metres west of its staggered crossroads junction with the existing A134 for a distance of 90 metres in a south-westerly direction;

- (b) to construct new highways, as follows:
 - a bridleway coincident with a new private means of access from the existing farm access track (Farm Drift, also forming Bridleway 1) from a point 50 metres west of the existing crossing over the disused railway running southwards and then eastwards, crossing the new Fornham St. Martin Bypass by means of an overbridge and rejoining the farm access road 120 metres south-east of the existing crossing;

a footpath from a point on the new bridleway 15 metres north-east of the disused railway running north-eastwards to the eastern boundary of the new Bypass for a distance of 20 metres (subject to stiles at OS grid reference points TL 85716695 and TL 85726697);

- a footpath from the junction of the existing A134 with the B1106 Culford Road by Flint Cottages following the route of the existing A134 running generally north-eastwards for a distance of 480 metres to the eastern boundary of the new Bypass (subject to kissing gates or stiles at OS grid reference points TL 85076736, TL 85186745, TL 85316755, TL 85336758 and TL 85406769 and coincident with a new means of access for a distance of 144 metres from the junction of the existing A134 with the B1106 Culford Road by Flint Cottages and also from a point 294 metres from that junction for a distance of 40 metres in a north-easterly direction);
- a new road from a point on the B1106 120 metres west-south-west of the western arm of its staggered crossroads junction with the A134 running generally eastwards for 64 metres;

 - part of the access track off the C737 Hollow Road near its roundabout junction with the A143 Compiegne Way for a length of 54 metres;

part of the farm access track (Farm Drift) also comprising Bridleway 1 for a length of 115 metres;

(d) to provide new means of access to premises to replace those stopped-up and also over part of the stopped-up A134 from its junction with B1106 Culford Road by Flint Cottages for 144 metres and between adjoining fields for 40 metres in a northeasterly direction from a point 294 metres from the junction of the stopped-up A134 with B1106 Culford Road;
