(c) to prohibit the loading and unloading from vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays in certain lengths of Hatherley Road.

Exceptions are contained in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or traffic warden or for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle or to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any wedding, funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic and the maintenance of any of the lengths of road or the services therein. An exception is also provided for the vehicle used in the service of a local Authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties. A further exception is provided to the waiting regulations in the case of a disabled person's vehicle.
