*The Trunk Road (A55) (Lay-bys, Llanfairfechan, Gwynedd)
(Restriction of Waiting) Order 1990*

Notice is hereby given that on 10th May 1990, the Secretary of State made the above Order which will come into operation on 24th May 1990.

The effect is as stated in Notice 4 SI in the *London Gazette* No. 52057 dated 22nd February 1990.

Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with, may, within 6 weeks of 10th May 1990, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

*The Cynon Valley Borough Council (Un-named Highway adjoining Fifth Avenue, Hirwaun Industrial Estate, Mid Glamorgan)
(Stopping-up) Order 199*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 211 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping-up of the highway described in the Schedule to this Notice to facilitate the movement of traffic on the main highway which is to be constructed in accordance with planning permission granted by Cynon Valley Borough Council on 15th February 1990.

During 28 days from 24th May 1990 copies of the draft Order and the relevant plan may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at Hirwaun Library, High Street, Hirwaun, Aberdare.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL (quoting ref. ZC 510-5-5-18), object to the making of the Order. In the preparation of an objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representations may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE

The highway to be stopped up is at Hirwaun Industrial Estate in the County of Mid Glamorgan. It is shown by zebra hatching on the deposited plan and is that length of un-named highway which extends from its junction with Fifth Avenue in a general south-easterly direction for a distance of 130 metres. NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

The New Town of Telford Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way at Randlay

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following route shown coloured red on the map referred to therein:

That length of footpath starting from a point marked 'A' on the map (located 100 metres north-east of the subway under Sturchley Avenue, and 75 metres east from the junction of Sturchley Avenue and Randlay Avenue) and running in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 300 metres to a point marked 'B' at the junction with an existing cycle/footpath and 130 metres east from the junction of Sturchley Avenue and Abbey Fields.

That length of footpath starting from a point marked 'C' on the map (located on the above-mentioned footpath, 40 metres south-east of point 'B') and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 50 metres to a point
