*Hanover, April 20. N. S.* His Electoral Highness intends to remove very soon to Vinehausen near Zell, in order to take the diversion of Hunting. The Elector and the Electress Dowager, have sent two Gentlemen to the Court of Wolfenbittel with Compliments of Condolence upon the Death of the late Duke. Eight and twenty Men have been disbanded out of every Company in the Regiment of Guards, and the rest of the Troops of his Electoral Highness are to be reduc'd in proportion. They write from Brunswick, that the Ministers of Denmark, Hanover and Holstein, have held several Conferences with the Plenipotentiaries of his Imperial Majesty, in relation to some Proposals that are to be made to the Assembly, when the Ministers of the other Princes are arrived. We have receiv'd advice from Holstein, that the Fortifications of Tonningen have been demolish'd by the King of Denmark's Order, and only the Wall towards the Eyder is preserv'd, for the Security of the Town from the Inundations of that River.

*Hamburgb, April 20. N. S.* Baron Frizendoff, Envoy of Sweden at the Court of Berlin, came hither some Days ago, in order to consult with Count

Welling upon the Affairs of the King his Master. General Spar, who has been in the Service of the most Christian King, is arrived here from Paris. His Prussian Majesty has assembled his Troops at Havelberg, Magdebourg, and Neven, where he intends to review them, and from thence to set out for Pomerania. The Ministers of Gottorp have offer'd to give that Prince entire Possession of Stetin, and to withdraw their Troops from thence, in case he will oblige the King of Denmark to evacuate Holstein; and as that Place is of great Importance to his Majesty, it is thought he will hearken to their Proposal. Count Flemming continues still at Berlin, in order to receive the Sum of Money the King of Prussia has promised his Master for the Expences of the Siege of Stetin. He is to return from thence to Leipzig, without going to the Congress at Brunswick. It is reported, that a defensive Alliance will be made very soon between Sweden, Prussia, and the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel; to which purpose it is said Monsieur Mardefeld is to go to Stockholm in Quality of Envoy Extraordinary of his Prussian Majesty. The Danish Fleet, consisting of Forty Men of War, will be ready to put to Sea about the beginning of next Month. The Senate of Sweden has order'd a List to be made of all Persons capable of bearing Arms, and several Bodies are to be form'd out of them, in order to oppose their Enemies that threaten to invade the Kingdom on all sides. They are likewise fitting out three Squadrons under the Command of the Admirals Watrang, Lille, and Lowenhaupt. That which is to be employ'd against the Muscovites, is to consist of Sixteen large Men of War and Twenty Gallies, and will be ready to set sail very soon, by which means it is believ'd they may be able to hinder the Danish and Muscovite Fleets from joining. The Czar has publish'd a Manifesto in Scania, in which he declares, That his design of entring into Sweden, is not to destroy the Country, but only to procure a reasonable Peace; exhorting the Inhabitants not to abandon their Dwellings, since they should be paid ready Money for the subsistence of his Troops, and he would deliver them from the Yoke they now labour under, by concluding a Treaty of Peace with the States, tho' the King should not consent to it. Letters from Constantiropole bring an Account, that the Grand Signior had refused to admit the Polish Ambassador to an Audience, and to ratify the Peace with the Republick, till he was put into Possession of the Province of Ukrain.

*Paris, April 21. N. S.* On the 11th the King went to Marli, where it is said he will continue till the 18th of next Month. On the 10th, the Peace between the Emperor and his Majesty was proclaimed here with the usual Ceremonies, and to Morrow there is to be a Firework before the Town-house upon that Occasion. The Troops of the Household have been review'd four Days successively before their Commanders; and on the 23d, there is to be a general Review in the Presence of his Majesty; after which it is said, those Troops will be reduced to Ten thousand Men. Cardinal del Guidice and Count Brancas are arrived here from Madrid.
