Hanover, April 20. N. S. His Electoral Highmeis intends to remove very foon to Vinehaufen rear Zell, in order to take the diverfion of Hunting. The Elector and the Electreis Dowager, have fent two Gentlemen to the Court of Wolfenbuttel with Compliments of Condoleance upon the Death of the late Duke. Eight and twenty Men have been difbanded out of every Company in the Regiment of Guards, and the reft of the Troops of his Electoral Highneis are to be reduc'd in proportion. They write from Brunfivick, that the Miniflers of Denmark, Hanover and Holftein, have held feveral Conferences with the Pleuipotentiaries of his Impetial Majefty, in relation to fome Propofals that are to be made to the Affembly, when the Miniflers of the other I rinces are arrived. We have receiv'd advice from Holftein, that the Fortifications of Tonningen have been demolified by the King of Denmark's Order, and only the Wall towards the Eyder is preferv'd, for the Security of the Town from the Inundations of that River.

Hamburgh, April 20. N. S. Baron Frizendoff, Envoy of Sweden at the Court of Berlin, came hither fome Days ago, in order to confult with Count

Welling upon the Affairs of the King his Mafter. General Spar, who has been in the Service of the most Christian King, is arrived here from Paris. His Prussian Majetty has assembled his Troops at Havelberg, Magdebourg, and Neven, where he intends to review them, and from thence to fet out for Pomerania. The Ministers of Gottorp have offer'd to give that Prince entire Possession of Stetin, and to withdraw their Troops from thence, in cafe he will oblige the King of Denmark to evacuate Holftein; and as that Place is of great Importance to his Ma-jelty, it is thought he will hearken to their Propofal. Count Flemming continues still at Berlin, in order to receive the Sum of Money the Kirg of Prussia has promised his Master for the Expences of the Siege of Stetin. He is to return from thence to Leipfic, without going to the Congress at Brunf-wick. It is reported, that a defensive Alliance will be made very foon between Sweden, Pruffia, and the Landgrave of Heffe Caffel; to which purpole it is faid Monfieur Mardefeld is to go to Stockholm in Quality of Envoy Extraordinary of his Prussian Majefty. The Danish Fleet, confishing of Forty Men of War, will be ready to put to Sea about the beginning of next Month. The Senate of Sweden has order'd a Lift to be made of all Perfons capable of bearing Arms, and feveral Bodies are to be form'd out of them, in order to oppose their Enemies that threaten to invade the Kingdom on all fides. They are likewife fitting out three Squa-drons under the Command of the Admirals Wattrang, Lille, and Lowenhaupt. That\_which is to be employ'd against the Muscovites, is to confist of Sixteen large Men of War and Twenty Galleys, and will be ready to fet fail very foon, by which means it is believ'd they may be able to hinder the Danish and Muscovite Fleets from joining. The Czar has publish'd a Manifesto in Scania, in which he de-clares, That his defign of entring into Sweden, is not to destroy the Country, but only to procure a reafonable Peace; exhorting the Inhabitants not to abandon their Dwellings, fince they should be paid ready Money for the Subfiftance of his Troops, and he would deliver them from the Yoke they now labour under, by concluding a Treaty of Peace with the States, tho' the King should not confent to it. Letters from Constantirople bring an Account, that the Grand Signior had refused to admit the Polish Ambaflador to an Audience, and to ratify the Peace with the Republick, till he was put into Possession of the Province of Ukrain.

Paris, April 21. N. S. On the 11th the King went to Marli, where it is taid he will continue till the 18th of next Month. On the 10th, the Peace between the Emperor and his Majeily was I roclaimed here with the ufual Ceremonies, and to Morrow there is to be a Firework before the Town-houfe upon that Occafion. The Troops of the Houthold have been review'd four Days fucceffively before their Commanders; and on the 23d, there is to be a general Review in the Prefence of his Majeffy; after which it is faid, those Troops will be reduced to Ten thoufand Men. Cardinal del Guidice ard Gount Brancas are arrived here from Madrid.
