The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Hereas Her Majesty as well by Her Royal Proclamations, as by feveral Orders in Council, was pleased to direct, That all Ships and Vessels coming from the Sound, the Baltick Sea, and other Places in or near Aliena, Gluckstadt, the Little East Hamburgh on the Elb, Bremen in the Weser, and Embden in the Eemes, which were then Infected with the Plague, fhould be obliged to perform their Quarentine, in order to prevent any Contagious Diftemper that might be brought from fuch Places into this Kingdom; and Her Majefty being informed by feveral Letters from Pruffia, and the Cities of Bremen and Hamburgh, and by Certificates from the Physicians of those Places, and also by a Petition of the Governor, Affiftants, and Fellow-ship of Merchants of Eastland, and other Authentick Testimonials, this Day present-ed and read at the Board, That there is not at prefent, nor hath been for fome time past, any Contagious Distemper in Hamburgh, Bremen, or the Ports of Dantzick, Koninsberg, Memel, Liban, Riga or Revel in the Baltick Sea, or Places thereunto adjoyning, Her Majesty upon Consideration thereof, is Gracioufly Pleas'd, with the Advice of Her Privy Council, to Order, as it is hereby Ordered, That the Quarentine be taken off from all Ships and Veffels coming from the faid Places, and that they be permitted to Difcharge their Ladings in any Ports of this Kingdom as formerly, with-out any Lett or Moleflation; and the Right Hon. the Lord High Treasurer of Great Britain, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, Her Majesty's Secretary at War, and all others whom it may Concern are to take notice hereof, and to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Stockbolm, April 9. N. S. On the 26th paft Lieutenant General Rank arrived here with Dispatches from the King at Demir-Tocca, and on the 28th he had a long Audience of the Queen-Dewagery and of the Princefs-Ulrica-Eleanora. The next Day the Senate was allembled, and the

principal Deputies of the Nobility being fent for, Count Horn told them, his Majefty would be very much difpleafed, if they perfifted in their Defign of conferring the Regency upon the Princeis. Upon which they alledged feveral Reafons to fhew the Neceffity of having their Demand complied with; but her Royal Highnefs, who was prefent, having declar'd that fhe would never confent to it, they agreed not to prefs her any more upon that Subject. It was thought the Affembly of the States would have separated upon this Declaration of the Princels, but at the Request of the Senate they have refolved to continue their Meeting for fome time longer; and the Deputies, who were gone home to their own Countries, are order'd to return hither immediately. Count Guldenstiern is appointed by the King to Command in Scania, and he is preparing to let out accordingly in a few Days. The Muscovites have undertaken no Defign fince the defeat of the fmall Body of Men we had on the Frontiers of Finland; and Advice is come from thence, that Major General Arnfeld hath gather'd together the remains of his Troops at Gammel and Carlebi, in order to hinder the Enemy's Progress

into the Country. Vienna, April 18. N. S. His Imperial Majesty having received the most Christian King's Ratifica-tion of the Treaty of Rastad, has order'd his Ple-nipotentiaries to hasten their departure to Baden. Yeiterday Monfieur Matueof, the Czar's Ambaf-fador, had an Audience of the Emperor, in which he paid his Majefty a Compliment of Condoleance upon the Death of the Duke of Wolfenbuttel, and at the fame time he notify'd the Victory obtain'd by the Mulcovites over the Swedes near Vafa in Finland. Count Leflie is appointed to be Provoft of Artacke, in the room of Count Rabutin, lately deceased. Orders are fent to Hungary, to repair the Fortifications of the Frontier Towns, and to add new Works in feveral Places where they were wanting. We have received advice from Turky, that the Rebels in Afia had entirely defeated an. Army of Forty thousand Men, which was fent by the Grand Signior to reduce them to their Obedience. The fame Letters add, that the Sophi of Perfia had granted his Protection to Ifinael Bacha, the chief Promoter of the Infurrection, and had fent him a Supply of Ammunition and Forces, whereupon the Ottoman Port was making great Preparations to fubdue him, before he became more Formidable.

Madrid, April 19. N. S. His Majesty has ap-pointed Sennor Bodillo to be Secretary of State, in the room of the Marquis de Mejorada, who has been declared Counfellor of Castile. Don Valero de Heredia, a Lieutenant General, who ferved near Forty Years in Flanders, is committed to Prifon in the Castle of Segovia, together with Don Manuel de Silva, a Member of the Council of the Indies. Don Francisco Ronquillo, late President of the Council of State, is banish'd the Court, and has obtain'd leave to retire to Arrevalo in Castile, the Place of his Birth. Some Days ago Count Bergeik fet out with his whole Family for the Low-Countries, where, it is faid, he intends to pais the reft of his Life. The Offices that were lately laid afide,
