Venice, April 20. N. S. The Magistrate of Health has dispensed with the Noblemen appointed to guard the Posts leading to this City, from their Attendance, and it is thought the Quarantine will soon be taken off from all Persons coming out of Germany. Signor Tron, who is appointed to go Ambassador to Great Britain, has deferred his Journey for some time longer upon his private Affairs. It is said the Electoral Prince of Saxony intends to return to this Place. They write from Rome, that Cardinal Bouillon arrived there on the 17th, and the same Day he had an Audience of the Pope, which lasted two Hours. The Employment of Vicario, which was held by the late Cardinal Carpegna, was order'd to be exercis'd by Monsignor Caracciolo, till the Pope thought fit to dispose of it; and in the mean time the Salary, amounting to One thousand Crowns of Gold a Month, was assigned to the Bishops of Catania and Giorgento, in Sicily.

Hamburg, May 1. N. S. The Danish Troops that were Posted hereabouts, to prevent the spreading of the Contagious Distemper, are at length removed from the Neighbourhood of this City, and it is hoped those of Hanover will likewise be withdrawn in a short time. The King of Denmark is expected in a Day or two at Gottorp; several Battalions of his Troops are already upon their March towards the Camp that has been mark'd out for them. Baron Spaar, a Swedish Lieutenant General, who was formerly employ'd in the Service of France, has been several times in Conference with Count Welling and

the Ministers of Holstein at this Place, and is now set out for Berlin, in order to make some Proposals to that Court in favour of Sweden and Holstein: But it is thought he will hardly succeed in his Negotiations, since the King of Prussia has assur'd the Emperor's Secretary, that he will engage in no Measures, which may occasion a new War in the Circle of Lower Saxony. All the Ministers are already arrived at the Congress of Brunswick, except those of the King of Sweden and King Augustus, and the latter are expected very soon. Letters from Stockholm bring an account, that the States of the Kingdom were still assembled, but they intended to separate in a few Days, after having appointed Deputies out of each Order, who are to remain at that Place, to take care of their Interests. It was reported, that a Treaty of Marriage was concluded between the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Cassel, and the Princess Ulrica Eleonora. They write from Petersbourg, that Monsieur Bassowitz, by the Czar's Command, had receiv'd a Copy of the Letters and Papers found in Tonningen, which he was told, had convinced his Majesty of the ill Intentions of the House of Holstein towards the King of Denmark, his Ally, and by consequence against the whole Confederacy, for which reason he was order'd to be gone from that Court, without any delay.

Brussels, May 1. N. S. The Regency being informed, that the Pestilential Distemper continues still among the Cattle in the United Provinces, have resolv'd to publish an Ediēt, strictly forbidding the bringing in of Cattle from thence, in order to prevent the Infection from spreading into these Countries. Count Clairmont, first Member of the Council of State, for the Administration of the Affairs of the Netherlands, is returned hither from Gand, where he was sent to demand an extraordinary Subsidy for the Payment of the Walloon Troops assign'd on that Province. Monsieur Pesters, the Dutch Intendant at Ipres, is come to this Place, at the request of Monsieur Vandenberg, Deputy of the States General, in order to assist him at the Conferences held here upon the Affairs of these Countries.

Paris, May 5. N. S. Last Week Cardinal Guidice was several hours in private with the King, and it is said his Majesty then adjust'd the Difficulties which have hitherto delay'd the Conclusion of the Peace between Spain and the States General. All Colonels of Regiments are order'd to repair to their several Commands by the 15th Instant. His Majesty has confer'd the Order of St. Lewis upon Monsieur Contade. The Prince of Georgia's Uncle is arriv'd in this City; It is said he is come to desire the King's Protection for his Nephew, who is obliged to pay excessive Tribute to the Grand Signor and the Sophi of Persia for leave to exercise the Christian Religion in his Dominions. Yesterday morning the Duke of Berry died at Marli after a short Indisposition, which it is supposed was occasioned by a Blow he received on his Stomach from the Pommel of his Saddle. Upon his Death the King is return'd to Versailles. They write from Toulon, that the Marquis de Mary was expected there with a Genesee Man of War, to convoy four Vessels, laden with Provisions for the Siege of Barcelona, to Mataro
