Venice, April 20. N.S. The Magistrate of Health has difpenfed with the Nobleman appointed to guard the Pofts leading to this City, from their Attendance, and it is thought the Quarentine will foon be taken off from all Perfons coming out of Germany. Signor Tron, who is appointed to go Ambaffador to Great Britain, has deferred his jour. ney for fome time longer upon his private Affairs. It is faid the Electoral Prince of Saxony intends to xeturn to this Place. They write from Rome, that Cardinal Bouillon arrived there on the 17th, 294 the fame Day he had an Audience of the Pope, which lasted two Hours. The Employment of Vicario, which was held by the late Cardinal Carpegna, was order'd to be exercis'd by Monfigror Caracciolo, till the Pope thought fit to difpole of it, and in the mean time the Salary, amounting to One thou-fand Crowns of Gold a Month, was affigned to the Bishops of Catania and Giorgento, in Sicily. Hamburgh, May 1. N. S. 1 he Danish Troops that

were Polled hereabouts, to prevent the spreading of the Contagious Diftemper, are at lergth removed from the Neighbourhood of this City, and it is hoped those of Hanover will likewise be withdrawn in a short time. The Kirg of Denmark is expected in a Day or two at Gottorp; jeyeral Battalions of his Troops are already upon their March towards the Camp that has been mark'd out for them. Baron Spaar, a Swedish Lieutenant General, who was formerly employ'd in the Service of France, has been feveral times in Conference with Count Welling and

the Ministers of Holstein at this Place, and is now fet out for Berlin, in order to make fome Propofals to that Court in favour of Sweden and Holftein: But it is thought he will hardly fucceed in his Nesolutions, fince the King of Pruffia has affur'd the Emperor's Secretary, that he will engage in no Measures, which may occasion a new War in the Circle of Lower Saxony. All the Ministers are al-ready arrived at the Congress of Brunswick, except those of the King of Sweden and King Au-gustus, and the latter are expected very foon. Let-ters from Stockholm bring an account, that the States of the Kingdom were still assembled, but they intended to separate in a few Days, after having appointed Deputies out of each Order, who are to remain at that Place, to take care of their Interests. It was reported, that a Treaty of Marriage was concluded between the Hereditary Prince of Heffe Caffel, and the Princess Ulrica Eleonora. They write from Petersbourg, that Monfieur Ballewitz, by the Czar's Command, had receiv'd a Copy of the Letters and Papers found in Tonningen, which he was told, had convinced his Majefty of the ill Intentions of the Houfe of Holftein towards the King of Denmark, his Ally, and by confequence against the whole Confederacy, for which reason he was ordered to be gone from that Court, without any delay.

Bruffels, May 1. N. S. The Regency being informed, that the Pestilential Distemper continues fill among the Cattle in the United Provinces, have refolved to publish an Edict, strictly forbidding the bringing in of Cattle from thence, in order to pravent the Infection from spreading into these Countries. Count Clairmont, first Member of the Council of State, for the Administration of the Affairs of the. Netherlands, is returned hither from Gand, where he was fent to demand an extraordinary Subfidy for the Payment of the Walloon Troops affign'd on that Province. Monfieur Pefters, the Dutch Intendant at Ipres, is come to this Place, at the requeit of Monfieur Vandenberg, Deputy of the States General, in order to affilt him at the Conferences held here upon the Affairs of these Countries. Upon his Death the King is return'd to Verfailles.
