High Street West, south side, from a point 2.7 metres west of its junction with Crowtree Road for a distance of 15 metres westwards.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Borough of Sunderland propose to make an Order under sections 1, 2, 4, 32, 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which would be: 1. To introduce the following restrictions on West Street: (a) no waiting at any time—east side—from its junction with the loading bay opposite Middle Street to the start of the access ramp opposite South Street; (b) Prohibition of Loading—8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday—east side—from its junction with St. Mary's Way to the start of the access ramp opposite South Street; (c) Disabled Parking Places—amend hours of operation to 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. and to be available as a taxi rank at other times. 2. To introduce the following restriction on the Central Area Western Service Area—the loading bay opposite Middle Street: No waiting at any time. 3. The general nature and effect of the Order will be to: (a) require vehicles using the parking places to display a current

vehicle excise licence; (b) increase the Council's charges at pay and display parking places; (c) restrict the use of part of the Community Centre Parking Place, Amersham to customers of the Chiltern Pools, Amersham; (d) provide for reserved spaces at the new Station Car Park, Amersham; (e) permit the Council to remove supermarket shopping trolleys left in any parking place and charge a fee on collection by the owner; (f) increase the excess charge. The car parks affected by the Order and the proposed charges are set out in the Schedule to the Order. RESTRICTIONS**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Enfield propose to make the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Order 19 under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the local Government Act 1985. 2. The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979, so that:— (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited: (i) at anytime in the lengths of streets specified in this Notice; (ii) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice; (b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited: (i) between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) (i) above; (ii) between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) (ii) above; (c) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Enfield Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; (d) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above, would be prohibited. 3. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2(a) and (b) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, eg, the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply. 4. A copy of the proposed Order, of maps indicating the location and effect of the proposed Order, of the Enfield (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979 (and of the Orders which have previously amended that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected at the Reception Desk, 'B' Block, the Civic Centre, Silver Street, Enfield, Middlesex, EN1 3XD during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 28 days from the date on which this Notice is published. 5.
