THE A6 TRUNK ROAD (BUXTON ROAD, BRIDGEMONT, DERBYSHIRE) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 1990

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that on 7th August 1990, he made an Order under sections 82 (2), 83 (1) and 84 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A6 Trunk Road.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 9th August 1990, will be that no person shall drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on that length of the A6 Trunk Road known as Buxton Road in the Borough of High Peak in the County of Derbyshire from a point 75 metres south-east of the centre point of Bothomes Hall Roundabout at Bridgemont to a point 302 metres south-east of its junction with Station Road at Furness Vale, a distance of approximately 1,110 metres.

Notice of the Secretary of State's intention to make this Order was published under the reference number 1 SI on 20th December 1989 in the *London Gazette*. The effect of this Order is the same as described in that notice, with a minor modification.

Any person who desire to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 8th August 1990, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
