Notice of application to vary a licence to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority Anglian Region by Silsoe College (Cranfield Institute of Technology), Silsoe, Bedford MK45 4DT, to vary the licence serial number 6/33/17/43 to abstract water from the Lower Greensand aquifer at National Grid Reference TL 080 353 in the Parish of Silsoe in the District of Mid Bedfordshire, in the county of Bedfordshire.

The variations applied for are (1) to extend the area of land where water is to be used to include parts of Silsoe College farm (2) to allow abstraction from up to a maximum of three points at the above grid reference (being three bore-holes lined with 150mm plastic casings and wellscreens extending to 30m depth and equipped with submersible pumps capable of abstracting up to 6 l/s each). Note there is no application to vary the existing licensed abstraction rates.

A copy of the application and of any map plan or other document submitted with it may be inspected free of charge at Silsoe College, Silsoe, Bedford MK45 4DT, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 1st September 1990, and ending on 30th September 1990.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Devon (Various Streets, Crediton) (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that on 17th August 1990 Devon County Council made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as published in the *London Gazette*, issue No. 52006, dated 2nd January 1990, reference No. 485, with the following amendments:

1. Deletion of Church Street from the no waiting at any time restrictions.

2. No waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive has been amended to:

Town Park:

North side and eastern end from its junction with St. Saviours Way eastwards for a distance of 50 metres to include the cul-de-sac end.

South side from a point 15 metres east of its junction with St. Saviours Way/Greenway.

Eastwards for its entire length north side from its junction with St. Saviours Way eastwards for a distance of 12 metres.

3. Waiting will be limited to 45 minutes (no return within 45 minutes) between the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive in the following length of road:

Town Park, north side, from a point 12 metres from its junction with St. Saviours Way eastwards for a distance of 119 metres.

The Order will come into effect on 27th August 1990.

Exemptions in the Order permit waiting for the purposes of boarding and alighting, loading and unloading, Post Office services, maintenance of the road, supply of gas, water and electricity, pursuance of statutory powers or duties, taking in petrol, oil or air from a garage. The statutory exemptions for disabled persons are included.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan showing the lengths of road affected, may be examined during usual office hours at the offices of Mid Devon District Council, 1 St. Peter's Street, Tiverton, or Crediton Town Council, Market Street, Crediton.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the date of the Order, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

KNOWSLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Council of the Borough of Knowsley (Various Roads, Prescot) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that on 17th August 1990 the Council of the Borough of Knowsley, in exercise of its powers, made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order which comes into effect on 20th August 1990, makes it unlawful for any person to cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the following sides of lengths of road:

- Houghton Street, Prescot, on its westerly side extending from a point 13.7 metres north of its junction with the un-named road adjacent to 110 Beaconsfield in a southerly direction to the tangent point at its junction with the un-named service road to the rear of properties 111-116 Beaconsfield;
- the un-named service road adjacent to 110 Beaconsfield on its northerly side extending from its junction with Houghton Street in a westerly direction for a distance of 13.7 metres;
- the un-named service road adjacent to 110 Beaconsfield on its southerly side, extending from its junction with Houghton Street in a westerly direction and then northerly direction for its full length to its tangent point with the parking bay to the front of Victoria House;
- the whole of the un-named service road to the rear of Victoria House, on both sides; and
- the un-named service road adjacent to 110 Beaconsfield on its northerly side extending from the tangent point of its junction with Pennington Gardens in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 31 metres.

Exemptions will allow waiting:

- to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle;
- for a period not exceeding two hours in every three hours, by a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge;
- to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded from a vehicle;

and in connection with:

- statutory powers and duties;
- collection and delivery of postal packets;
- the maintenance of the roads and services therein;
- building operations; and
- supplying gas, electricity and water.
