Changes to Parking Places in Bickenhall Street

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council on 28th August 1990 made the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No. 29) Order 1990 and the City of Westminster (Doctor Parking Place) (Revocation No. 2) Order 1990 under sections 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The effect of the Orders is as described in the notice of proposal to make the Orders which appeared in the *London Gazette* (issue number 51815) dated 20th July under ref. No. 491.

A copy of each of the Orders, which will come into force for the purposes of placing traffic signs, etc. on 31st August 1990 and for all other purposes on 3rd September 1990, and of a map which indicates each length of road to which the Orders relate can be inspected between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays until 11th October 1990 at One Stop Services, Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QP.

Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to either of the Orders may make application for the purpose to the High Court by 11th October 1990.

Parking Places Amendments—Victoria Ward

Notice is hereby given that the Westminster City Council propose to make the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No.) Order 1990 under section 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be to:

- (a) Lengthen a certain 2-hour metered parking place in Abbey Orchard Street.
- (b) Lengthen certain residents' parking places in Great College Street, Great Peter Street, Lord North Street, Monck Street and Old Pye Street.
- (c) Convert certain 2-hour metered parking places in Abbey Orchard Street, Great Peter Street and a 4-hour metered parking place in Lord North Street into residents' parking places.

(d) Provide new residents parking places in Abbey Orchard Street, Great College Street and Great Peter Street.

(e) Revoke certain 2-hour metered parking places in Abbey Orchard Street.

(f) Provide that the initial charge in the 2-hour metered parking places would be at the rate of 50p for 20 minutes (maximum initial period 2 hours), the excess charge (payable to Westminster City Council) would be £20, the excess period would be 30 minutes, any unexpired shown on a parking meter may be used free of charge, the period during which a vehicle may not return to a parking place would be 1 hour and the vehicles which may be left in the parking places shall be passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), certain goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages;

(g) Provide that the vehicles which may be left in the residents' parking places shall be those displaying a valid parking card bearing the letter "D", issued by the City Council in respect of that vehicle. The charge for the use of the residents' parking places would be 50 pence per day, unless a valid season ticket is displayed. Season tickets cost £15 for 3 months or £55 for 12 months.

(h) Provide that the parking places would operate between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (Christmas Day, Good Friday and Bank Holidays excepted).

(i) Provide that certain vehicles may wait free of charge in certain circumstances, e.g., to allow persons to board or alight (maximum 2 minutes), to load or unload (maximum 20 minutes) and vehicles left by specified disabled persons (no time limit).

A copy of the proposed Order, of the City of Westminster (Parking Places) (No. 5) Order 1974 and of the Orders which have previously amended or applied that Order, of plans which indicate the locations and effects of the Order and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected between 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in the One Stop Services (First Floor), Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QP.

Any objections or other representations about the proposed Order should be sent in writing, to the Director of Planning and Transportation, Westminster City Hall, 64 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QP, quoting ref. HEREFORD AND WORCESTER COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Hereford and Worcester (College Precincts and College Street, Worcester) Various Traffic Orders 1990

Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make Orders under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(2), 32(1) and 35(1) of, and part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be:

(1) (*College Precincts and College Street, Worcester*) (*Prohibition of Waiting*) Order 1990:

To prohibit waiting at any time in those sides of lengths of College Precincts and College Street in the City of Worcester in the County of Worcester specified in Schedule 1 to this notice.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purpose of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) Loading and/or unloading goods;
- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) delivering and collecting furniture and effects with police consent;
- (e) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply and maintenance of any gas, electricity, water and telecommunications apparatus;
- (f) the fire brigade, ambulance or police services;
- (g) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties (if no other road can be conveniently used).

An exemption in the Order also permits the waiting by disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme for a limited period of 2 hours, return prohibited within a further period of 1 hour.

(2) (*College Precincts, Worcester*) (*Prohibition of Driving*) Order 1990:

To prohibit any vehicle from proceeding or waiting in that length of College Precincts in the City of Worcester in the County of Hereford and Worcester which extends from a point measured along the centre line of College Precincts 19 metres (62 feet) south of the south-western kerb-line of College Street for a distance of 11 metres (36 feet) in a southerly direction.
