NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

The New Town of Telford Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way at Randlay

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981 has made an order extinguishing as from the date of the order Public Rights of Way over the following routes shown coloured red on the map referred to therein:

That length of footpath starting from a point marked 'A' on the map (located 100 metres north-east of the subway under Stirchley Avenue and Randlay Avenue) and running in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 300 metres to a point marked 'B' at the junction with an existing cycle/footpath and 130 metres east from the junction of Stirchley Avenue and Abbey Fields.

That length of footpath starting from a point marked 'C' on the map (located on the above mentioned footpath, 40 metres south-east of point 'B') and running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 50 metres to a point marked 'D' at the junction with an existing cycle/footpath and 180 metres east from the junction of Stirchley Avenue and Abbey Fields.

The Order is dated 12th September 1990, and a copy of it and of the map referred to in it showing the rights of way which have been extinguished and the alternative route proposed may be inspected at the offices of the Telford Development Corporation, New Town House, Telford Square, Town Centre, Telford, Shropshire TF3 4JS during normal office hours.
