TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (Newport Road, Caldicot, Gwent) Order 1990

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has, on the application of the Monmouth Borough Council, made the above Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 extinguishing subject to some exceptions any rights persons may have to use vehicles on the length of highway described in the Schedule to this notice.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the Offices of Monmouth Borough Council, New Cash Office, Woodstock Way, Caldicot; and Monmouth Borough Council, Mamhilad House, Mamhilad Park Estate, Pontypool.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act;

he may within 6 weeks of the 4th October 1990 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

Any person, who at the time of coming into force of the Order, has an interest in land having lawful access to the length of highway to which the Order relates shall be entitled to be compensated by the Monmouth Borough Council as the Local Planning Authority in respect of any depreciation in the value of his interest which is directly attributable.

Any claim for such compensation must be submitted within 6 months of 4th October 1990.

SCHEDULE

The highway is at Caldicot in the county of Gwent and is that length of highway known as Newport Road which extends on its northern side from its junction with the eastern side of Jubilee Way to its junction with Sandy Lane, and on its southern side from the lay-by adjacent to the Gateway Supermarket to its junction with Chepstow Road.
