- (v) the provision of new means of access to premises in pursuance of the Essex County Council Colchester to Clacton Classified Road A133 (Little Clacton and Weeley Heath By-pass) Side Roads Order 1990;
- (vi) the diversion of drains and watercourses and the carrying out of other works on drains and watercourses in connection with the construction and improvement of highways as aforesaid; and
- (vii) use by the said Council in connection with the construction and improvement of highways, the diversion of drains and watercourses, and the carrying out of other works on water courses as aforesaid.

3. The classified unnumbered road known as Pandy Lane between Llanbradach and Ystrad Mynach.

4. The unclassified road between Twyn Shon Ifan Cottages and its junction with the existing A469 at The Cooper's Arms, Ystrad Mynach.

5. Cart Road/Bridleway No. 184/Bedwas and Machen.

(c) To construct new highways, generally to take the place of the highways to be stopped-up.
