SOUTHEND-ON-SEA BOROUGH COUNCIL

THE PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS)
ACT 1990

Conservation Areas at Kemble Station, Adlestrop, Ampney Crucis, Little Barrington, Lower Swell, Naunton, Sherborne and Todenham

Notice is hereby given that the Cotswold District Council has designated Kemble Station, in the county of Gloucestershire, as a Conservation Area, pursuant to sections 69 and 70 of The Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990. Seven other, existing, Conservation Areas have also been reviewed.

Maps of the designated and reviewed Conservation Areas have been deposited at the offices of the Cotswold District Council at Trinity Road, Cirencester and the Council Offices at Moreton-in-Marsh and may be inspected during normal office hours.

The new designation comprises:

Kemble Station

The entire station is designated, together with buildings in the vicinity of The Tavern, The Bridge, Western Villa and Railway Terrace. This designation is separate from Kemble Conservation Area.

The following Conservation Areas have been reviewed:

1. Adlestrop

Four amendments have been carried out. Parkland at Adlestrop House and woodland to the east of Reality House are added to the Conservation Area, while Orchard Bungalow and the Village Hall are both deleted.

2. Ampney Crucis

Numerous changes have resulted in additions at Ampney Park, along the A417, fields to the south and west of Ampney House, the cemetery and land to the east and west of Birch Farm. The main deletions are; the housing development at Dudley Farm, Nos. 34 and 35 Barnes Croft, a modern property to the rear of No. 26 and three bungalows opposite the football field.

3. Little Barrington

This designation had been substantially enlarged to include water meadows to the north and east of the village. The Conservation Area now extends as far east as Paper Mill Cottages and north to the River Windrush. It also abuts the south eastern corner of Great Barrington Conservation Area.

4. Lower Swell

An extention to the north and east brings Searchan Coppice and Bowl Farm (part of Abbotswood Park) within the Conservation Area. Modern development, at Whittlestone Hollow and Whittlestone Close, has been deleted, together with agricultural buildings and further modern housing opposite Rectory Close.

5. Naunton

Naunton Conservation Area has been extended to include the valley sides to the south of Dale Street and to the north of Mill View. The latter also brings in woodland known as The Brake.

6. Sherborne

This designation previously only covered the linear settlement of Sherborne itself. The revised Conservation Area is substantially larger and now includes most of Sherborne Park, to the north and south of the village. Cheltenham Lodges, Home Farm and Northfield Barn are all included, together with a westward extension along Sherborne Brook to Haycroft Farm.

7. Todenham

Several changes have been made to this designation. The largest of these is the inclusion of land which provides an important setting to the east of Todenham Manor. The other amendments have resulted in deleting the Farriers Arms car park; modern development
