Notice of Designation of New Conservation Areas within the West Dorset Area

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 69 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, that the West Dorset District Council after consultation with Dorset County Council and other relevant bodies have determined that the areas described in the Schedule to this notice are areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, and have accordingly designated as Conservation Areas on 8th November 1990.

The effect of the designation is as follows:

- Where an application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the extended Conservation Area is made, the application will be subject to the special procedure laid down by section 73 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.
- Anyone wishing to demolish a building or part of a building situate within a Conservation Area must first apply for consent to the Local Planning Authority. Some buildings may be exempt.
- Anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop, uproot, damage, or otherwise destroy any tree situate within a Conservation Area must give 6 weeks prior notice of intention to the Council. Plans of the area/s may be inspected during normal office hours at the office of the West Dorset District Council, Planning Department, 58-60 High West Street, Dorchester, Dorset and at Mountfield, Rax Lane, Bridport, Dorset and/or at Manor House, Newlands, Sherborne, Dorset.

 - between points Y1 and Y2 on Plan 'A', diverting pedestrians on to a new route approximately 2 metres wide immediately adjacent to the present route of the relevant part, shown on Plan 'A' between those points and thereon coloured red.
 - between points Y2 and Y6 on Plan 'A', diverting pedestrians on to a new route:
 - approximately two metres wide and shown edged red on Plan 'A' between points Y2, Y3 and Y4 thereon; and
 - along the existing highway known as Petts Lane between points Y4 and Y6 on Plan 'A'.
