PARLIAMENTARY NOTICES

HARBOURS ACT 1964

Wightlink Limited

Notice is hereby given that Wightlink Limited ("the Company"), which is a subsidiary of Sea Containers Ltd., has applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to make a Harbour Revision Order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The objects of the proposed Order are:

1. To transfer the undertaking of Sealink Harbours Limited ("Sealink") at Lymington Pier in Lymington harbour ("the transferred pier") from Sealink to the Company (which is currently managing the transferred pier as agent for Sealink pursuant to an Agreement between Sealink and the Company under powers contained in section 14(1)(a) of the Transport Act 1962).
2. To authorise Sealink as from the commencement of the Order to continue and maintain the linkspan which forms part of the transferred pier. This power will be transferred by the Order to the Company on the day of transfer referred to below.
3. To confer on the Company on and after the day when the transferred pier is transferred to it under the Order ("the day of transfer") a power to make reasonable charges for services and facilities at the transferred pier corresponding to the power for that purpose which Sealink at present enjoys under paragraph 3 of Schedule 1 to the Transport Act 1981.
4. To confer on the Company on and after the day of transfer power to dispose of property no longer required for the purposes of the transferred pier.
5. To provide that on and after the day of transfer the Company shall exercise jurisdiction as harbour authority, and its piermaster shall exercise his powers, within a small water area adjacent to the transferred pier which is shown coloured pink on the plan referred to in the draft Order and to incorporate for that purpose certain provisions of the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847 with appropriate modifications. The Order provides that these powers conferred on the Company and its piermaster are subject to the overriding jurisdiction of the Lymington Harbour Commissioners and their master.

A copy of the draft Order which accompanies the application and of the plan relating thereto may be seen at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Company at Lymington Pier, Lymington, Hampshire and at the offices of the under-mentioned Parliamentary Agents.

Any person wishing to object to the application should write to the Secretary, Department of Transport, Room 1/2, Sunley House, 90 High Holborn, London WC1V 6LP, within 42 days from the date at the foot of this notice, quoting ref. P89/3/0284 and stating the grounds of his objection.
