The Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restrictions) (No. 4) Experimental Traffic Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon, on 5th December 1990, made the above-mentioned Order under sections 9 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985, which will come into operation on 17th December 1990.

2. The general effect of the Order will be to suspend the waiting restrictions in Middle Street. Croydon in so far as they apply to that part of the north-east side of the north-west to south-east arm of Middle Street which lies between a point 6 metres south of the party wall of Nos. 12 and Nos. 14 to 32, High Street, Croydon and its junction with the south-west to north-east arm of Middle Street.

3. The Order provides that in pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Borough Solicitor for the time being, or some person authorised in that behalf by him may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, modify or suspend this Order or any provision thereof.

4. A copy of the Order and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, until the expiration of a period of 6 months from that date, at the Enquiry Counter, 6th Floor, Borough Secretary's Department, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

5. Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Legal Services Department, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon. Further information may be obtained by telephoning the Public Services and Works, Traffic Management Department, London Borough of Croydon, on 081-686 4433, extension 2606.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

7. If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than 6 months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984. Any person desiring to object to the making of the Order under section 6 of the said Act of 1984 for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation in force may, within the aforementioned period of 6 months, send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Legal Services Department, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon.

The Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that the council of the London Borough of Croydon propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to further amend the Croydon (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977 so that:

- (a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the length of Marlpit Lane, Coulsdon specified in the Schedule to this notice;
- (b) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited between 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the length of street referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above.

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraphs 2(a), and 2(b) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the dirdction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g. the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc.
