to ban motor vehicles and cycling from the pedestrian zone in Nuneaton town centre between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive. At all other times the existing restrictions will apply.

A motor vehicle will be exempted from this ban if it is being used:

- in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to, any road in the zone, of any of the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations,
 - (ii) the removal of obstructions to traffic,
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road, and
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to, any of those roads, of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (2) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
- (3) to proceed to or from any disabled persons' parking place situated in the zone and the vehicle is a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge. 7 additional disabled person's parking places are to be provided, 2 in Abbey Street, 1 in Harefield Road, 2 in Newdegate Street and 2 in Queens Road (these 7 parking places will provide parking for 46 vehicles);
- (4) in the service of a local authority or water or sewerage undertaker or the National Rivers Authority, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties which are being undertaken in the zone;
- (5) to deliver or collect cash or securities to or from any bank or building society in the zone and the vehicle is a vehicle specially constructed for the conveyance of cash or securities;
- (6) by a registered medical practitioner, nurse or midwife when visiting a patient in premises in the zone;
- (7) for wedding or funeral purposes and access to the vehicle is required to premises in the zone.
- (2) to make Stratford Street one-way northbound;
- (3) to impose waiting restrictions as mentioned in Schedule 1 below;
- (4) to ban loading and unloading as mentioned in Schedule 2 below.

The existing waiting restriction Order, on the town centre, together with its 9 variation Orders, will be consolidated into the new waiting restriction Order.
