

1. Subject to certain exceptions, no buildings or part of a building situated in the Conservation Area, shall be demolished without the prior consent of the Local Planning Authority.
2. Subject to certain exceptions, at least 6 weeks notice must be given to the Local Planning Authority of any intention to undertake work on any tree within the Conservation Area.
3. Special attention shall be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the Conservation Area.
4. The Local Planning Authority have a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the Conservation Area.
5. Planning applications for development which would, in the opinion of the Local Planning Authority, affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area must be given publicity, and any representations received taken into account in determining the application.

Horsham District Council (Footpath 1914) Diversion Order 1990

PLANNING (LISTED BUILDING AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Designation of Extension to Highgate Conservation Area
