

B. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with Commission Decision 90/451/EEC made under Council Directive 72/462/EEC signed by an official veterinarian of the Government of Namibia stating:

- 1.(a) Details of consignment (species of animal, nature of cuts, nature of packaging, number of cuts or packages, net weight).
- (b) Address(es) and veterinary approval numbers approved slaughterhouse(s) and cutting plant(s).
- (c) Destination of meat (place of loading, country and place of destination, and means of transport, names and addresses of consignor and consignee).

2. Health attestation:

The deboned fresh meat of domestic animals of the bovine species described above:

(a) is obtained free

(i) animals which were born and reared in Namibia and which have remained outside that part of the foot-and-mouth disease control area in Namibia, north of the "Cordon Fences" which extend from Palgrave Point in the west to Gam in the east for at least 12 months preceding slaughter or since birth in the case of animals less than 12 months,

(ii) animals which have not been vaccinated against foot-and-mouth disease during the preceding 12 months,

(iii) animals which on the way to the slaughterhouse and while awaiting slaughter therein have not come into contact with animals not satisfying the requirements laid down in Commission Decision 90/451/EEC as regards export of their meat to a Member State, and if they were conveyed by vehicle or container the latter was cleaned and disinfected before loading,

(iv) animals which when subjected to an ante-mortem health inspection at the slaughterhouse during the 24 hours preceding slaughter showed no symptoms of foot-and-mouth disease,

(v) animals which have been slaughtered on different days from those on which animals which do not comply with the conditions required for export of their meat to the European Economic Community were slaughtered,

(vi) animals which were slaughtered on (date of slaughter).

(b) the boned fresh meat described above:

(i) has been produced on different days to that which does not comply with the conditions required for export to the Community,

(ii) originates from carcasses which have matured at a room temperature of more than +2°C for at least 24 hours after slaughter and before the bones were removed,

(iii) has had the major accessible lymphatic glands removed,

(iv) has, during all stages of its production, deboning, packing and storage been kept strictly separate from meat not conforming to the requirements for export to a Member State laid down in Commission Decision 90/451/EEC.

(c) Meat imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an Officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such a manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.

Notes Attaching to Licence C

1. Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the Imported Food Regulations 1984 or the Medicines Acts 1968 and 1971 or by any regulation superseding or amending the same, or any prohibition, regulation or restriction imposed by the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry.

2. This is not a Department of Trade and Industry licence.

3. This licence will not be invalidated by transit of the products through any other country provided they are transported in sealed containers and provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en route the containers are resealed and the documents are endorsed accordingly.

Caution: Any breach of any conditions attached to this licence will constitute an offence against the Animal Health Act 1981.

Conditions Attaching to Licence D

1. In accordance with Article 2 of Commission Decision 82/527/EEC dated 22nd July 1982, the offals may not enter Great Britain for at least 21 days from the date of slaughter.

2. Health attestation:

the offal of domestic animals of the bovine species described above.

(a) is obtained from:

(i) animals which were born and reared in the Republic of South Africa, and which have remained outside the areas referred to in Article 1(a) of Commission Decision 82/527/EEC for at least twelve months preceding slaughter or since birth in the case of animals less than twelve months old;

(ii) animals which have not been vaccinated against foot and mouth disease during the preceding twelve months;

(iii) animals which on the way to the slaughterhouse and while awaiting slaughter therein have not come into contact with animals not satisfying the requirements laid down in Commission Decision 82/527/EEC as regards export of their meat to a Member State and if they were conveyed by vehicle or container, the latter was cleaned and disinfected before loading;

(iv) animals which when subjected to an ante-mortem health inspection at the slaughterhouse during the 24 hours preceding slaughter showed no symptoms of foot and mouth disease;

(v) animals which have been slaughtered on different days from those on which animals which do not comply with the conditions required for export of their meat to the European Community were slaughtered;

(vi) animals which were slaughtered on.....(date of slaughter).

(b) has been produced on different days to that which does not comply with the conditions required for export to the Community;

(c) has matured at a room temperature of more than +2°C for at least three hours;

(d) has, during all stages of its production, packing and storage been kept strictly separate from offal not conforming to the requirements for export to a Member State laid down in Commission Decision 82/527/EEC.
