- (b) has been produced on different days to that which does not comply with the conditions required for export to the Community,
- (c) originates from carcases which have matured at a room temperature of more than +2°C for at leeast 24 hours after slaughter and before the bones were removed,
- (d) has had the major accessible lymphatic glands removed,
- (e) has, during all stages of its production, de-boning, packing and storage been kept strictly separate from meat not conforming to the requirements for export to a Member State laid down in Commission Decision 82/527/EEC.

B. Any meat imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection.
