



*Hague, July 10. N. S.* On the 6th Instant the Ministers of the Czar, the King of Denmark, and King Augustus, were in Conference with the Deputies of the States General in the Chamber of Treves, and afterwards the Earl of Strafford, and Monsieur de Chateaufeuf, Ambassador of France, held a Conference with the same Ministers, upon the Subject of a Suspension of Arms in the North. Monsieur Van den Bergh, Deputy of the States-General at Brussels, is expected very soon from thence.

*Kensington, June 29.* This Evening Baron Bothmar, Envoy Extraordinary from the Elector of Brunswick, had a private Audience of Her Majesty, to notify the Death of the Princess Sophia, Electress and Dutchess Dowager of Hanover; to which he was introduced by the Right Hon. Mr. Secretary Bromley, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies.
