City of Stoke-on-Trent (Shelton Area) (Control of Parking) Order 1990

Part I

Schedule of Streets where Residents may apply for Residents' or Visitors' Permits

Carlton Road, Spencer Road, Thornton Road, all. Boughey Road from Leek Road to Cauldon Road.

Schedule of Residents on Street Parking Places, Stoke 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Saturday

The areas of carriageways of the following highways bounded by the edge of the carriageway and having a width of 1.8 metres throughout.

Carlton Road, north side: from a point 5 metres east of the boundary wall of the Polytechnic for a distance of 88 metres in an easterly direction.

Spencer Road, north side: from a point 7 metres east of the boundary wall of the Polytechnic for a distance of 87 metres in an easterly direction.

Thornton Road, south side: from a point 7 metres east of the boundary wall of the Polytechnic for a distance of 87 metres in an easterly direction.

Boughey Road, west side:

Boughey Road, east side

1. From the southern boundary of 79 Boughey Road for 29 metres in a southerly direction.

2. Five metres north and south of the access into car sales area.

3. From a point 43 metres south of the junction with Spencer Road for a distance of 15 metres into Leek Road. West side: 1. From the southern boundary of 144 Boughey Road, a distance of 17 metres northwards.

Thornton Road, north side:

1. From the western boundary of 77 Thornton Road eastwards for 4 metres.

From rear access road a distance of 4 metres eastwards and 4 metres westwards.

South side: From rear access road a distance of 4 metres eastwards and 4 metres westwards.
