PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Newland Village

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to section 69(1) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, that the South Lakeland District Council on 15th January 1991, in exercise of its powers under section 69 of the said Act, designated Newland Village as a Conservation Area. Particulars of the Conservation Area are set out in the Schedule hereto.

A plan indicating the precise boundary of the Conservation Area may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the South Lakeland District Council, Planning Department, Lowther Street, Kendal, Cumbria and Town Hall, Ulverston, Cumbria, during normal office hours.

The effect of the designation is that special attention will be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area designated. The Local Planning Authority require development to be of a high standard of design and in sympathy with the surroundings. In addition, controls are applied regarding the demolition of buildings (owners are required to apply to the South Lakeland District Council for consent before carrying out works of demolition to any building or part of a building within the area); the felling, topping or lopping etc. of trees within the area (notice is required to be given to the Council 6 weeks before the proposed works are carried out); advertisements; and permitted development rights under the General Development Order 1988 are more restricted than in other areas. Penalties apply in the event of violations against this control.

SCHEDULE

The designated area includes that part of Newland extending from A590 at Grid Ref. SD 299 795 north along Egton-with-Newland Parish boundary to the escarpment on Newland Beck. Then east from the escarpment and along the north bank of Newland Beck to the dam and weir north-east of the village; then south to the filling station on the A590 and follow the A590 back to Grid Ref. SD 299 795 (excluding the station and OS field 0762).

- The prior approval of the District Planning Authority may be required for the demolition of buildings within the Conservation Area (Applications for approval may be made separately or as part of an application for planning permission for the redevelopment of a site within the Conservation Area).
