

- (c) Certain trees within the Conservation Area cannot be felled, topped or lopped or uprooted without the consent of the West Oxfordshire District Council. If the trees are subject to wilful damage or wilful destruction an offence may have been committed.
- (d) If it is intended to demolish any building or part of a building to carry out any work which may in anyway affect a tree within the Conservation area the advice of the West Oxfordshire District Council should be sought.
- (e) The West Oxfordshire District Council as District Planning Authority will exercise particular care to ensure that change, when it occurs, does not detract from the character of the area.

Sutherland Rights of Way Application 1991

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the British Coal Corporation in connection with the working of coal by opencast operations propose to apply under section 15 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 to the Secretary of State for an order suspending non-vehicular rights of way as described in the Schedule below.
- 2. Opencast planning permission for the working has been applied for.
- 3. A copy of the application and of the map showing the rights of way can be inspected at the Great Wyrley Community Centre, Landywood Lane, Great Wyrley between the hours of 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m., Monday to Friday from 18th February 1991 to 5th April 1991.
- 4. Alternative ways for use by the public during the period for which the order will be in force will be made available as described in the Schedule below.
- 5. Written objections, stating the grounds on which objections are made, may be sent by any person to the Secretary of State before 5th April 1991 at the Department of the Environment, Room C16/21, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB. If the district council or county council in whose area any part of the rights of way lie objects and do not withdraw their objection the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry: if any other person objects and does not withdraw his objection he may arrange a public inquiry if he thinks fit.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

Rights of Way to be Suspended

- 1. Part of Footpath No. 14 in the Parish of Great Wyrley, the District of South Staffordshire and the County of Staffordshire. The footpath runs from Jacob's Hall Lane adjacent to the western side of Sutherland Farm, in a south easterly direction to a point on the Parish boundary at the watercourse which is a tributary to the Wash Brook. The extent of Suspension is that part which runs from a point about 180 metres south east of Jacob's Hall Lane for a distance of about 500 metres to a point on the said watercourse, about 300 metres north west of Hobbles End Farm, Hobbles End Lane.
- 2. Part of Footpath No. 21 in the Parish of Essington, the District of South Staffordshire and the County of Staffordshire. The footpath which is a continuation of footpath No. 14 runs from the point referred to above; on the Parish boundary where it crosses the watercourse which is a tributary to the Wash Brook; to its

junction with Hobbles End Lane, about 10 metres west of Hobbles End Farm, Hobbles End Lane. The extent of Suspension is that part which runs from the said point referred to above for a distance of about 230 metres to a point about 90 metres north west of Hobbles End Farm, Hobbles End Lane.

- 3. Part of the Claimed Footpath referred to as the "Sneyd Linear Walkway" (South Cannock Land Renewal Plan, 1982). The claimed footpath lies in the Parish of Essington, the District of South Staffordshire and the County of Staffordshire. The claimed footpath follows the towpath alongside the disused Sneyd and Wyrley branches of the Wyrley and Essington Canal. More specifically the section south of Long Lane Bridge, Long Lane, Newtown, south of Great Wyrley, passing beneath the Cannock to Walsall railway line. The extent of Suspension is that part which runs from a point about 305 metres south of Long Lane Bridge, Long Lane, Newtown, south of Great Wyrley, to a point a further 82 metres along the towpath heading in an easterly direction, passing beneath the Cannock to Walsall railway line, about 330 metres south of the Long Lane railway bridge, Newtown, south of Great Wyrley.

PART 2

Alternative Ways

Two alternative ways will be provided as described below:

- 1. From a point 90 metres north west of Hobbles End Farm, Hobbles End Lane, south of Great Wyrley, running in a north easterly direction for about 530 metres to a point along the Cadman's Lane bridlepath, 370 metres north east of Hobbles End Farm, Hobbles End Lane.
- 2. From a point along the disused Wyrley Bank Branch of the Wyrley and Essington Canal, about 305 metres south of Long Lane Bridge, Long Lane, running for about 90 metres in an easterly direction, passing beneath the Cannock to Walsall railway line, to a point along the disused Sneyd Branch of the Wyrley and Essington Canal, on the eastern side of the Cannock to Walsall railway line, about 330 metres south of the Long Lane railway bridge.
