### ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1981

#### *The Importation of Embryos, Ova and Semen Order 1980 (as amended)*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food by this licence issued under the Importation of Embryos, Ova and Semen Order 1980 (as amended) hereby authorises the importation into England, in accordance with the conditions set out overleaf.

Frozen Bovine Embryos originating in Belgium, the Federal Republic of Germany, France, Greece, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain at Ports/airports in England.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food is hereunto affixed on 1st April 1991.

This licence is valid for imports of frozen bovine embryos collected and processed in one of the Member States listed above on or after 1st January 1991 until varied or revoked by the Minister.

This licence comes into force with effect from 1st April 1991.

#### *Conditions for the importation of Frozen Bovine Embryos collected and processed on or after 1st January 1991 under General Licence*

1. All landings of embryos shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Embryos, Ova and Semen Order 1980 (as amended) and with the following provisions of this licence.
2. Each consignment of embryos shall be accompanied by an animal health certificate in accordance with Council Directive 89/556/EEC (published in Official Journal No. L 302/1 of 19th October 1989), signed by an official veterinarian of the exporting country.
3. Each consignment of embryos must have been stored after collection under approved conditions in the country of origin for a minimum period of 30 days before dispatch.
4. The consignment of embryos shall be transported in a flask sealed in the presence of the certifying veterinary officer.
5. The flask shall carry a mark to identify it with the animal health

certificate referred to at 2 above.

6. Consignees must notify, in writing, at least 24 hours in advance of the expected date of import, the local Divisional Veterinary Officer or the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, of their intention to import embryos, in particular the nature of the consignment and the anticipated arrival date.

7. On entry the animal health certificate must be presented to HM Customs and Excise for checking and endorsement and then accompany the consignment to its destination where it should be retained for a minimum period of 12 months for presentation to the Ministry on request.

NOTE. This licence applies only to consignments of frozen bovine embryos collected and processed on or after 1st January 1991. Any person wishing to import frozen bovine embryos collected and processed before 1st January 1991 should apply for a specific import licence to the appropriate address below:

### ANIMAL HEALTH AND WELFARE ACT 1984

#### *The Importation of Bovine Semen Regulations 1984*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food by this licence issued under the Importation of Bovine Semen Regulations 1984 hereby authorises the importation into England, in accordance with the conditions set out overleaf.

Deep frozen bovine semen originating in Member States of the European Community at Ports/Airports in England.

This licence is valid for imports of deep frozen bovine semen collected and processed in a Member State on or after 1st January 1990 until varied or revoked by the Minister.

This licence comes into force with effect from 1st April 1991.

#### *Conditions for the Importation of Deep Frozen Bovine Semen Collected and Processed on or after 1st January 1990 under General Licence*

1. All landings of semen shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Bovine Semen Regulations 1984 and with the following provisions of this licence.
2. Each consignment of semen shall be accompanied by an animal health certificate in accordance with Council Directive 88/407/EEC as amended by Council Directive 90/120/EEC (published in Official Journals No. L194 of 22nd July 1988 and No. L71 of 17th March 1990 respectively), signed by an official veterinarian of the exporting country.
3. The consignment of semen shall be transported in a flask sealed in the presence of the certifying veterinary officer.
4. The flask shall be clearly marked with the name and address of the dispatching AI centre and the number of the animal health certificate referred to at 2 above.
5. Consignees must notify, in writing, at least 24 hours in advance
