Proposed reconstruction of apron to sea wall at Marine Drive, Scarborough

BARNESLEY METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Metropolitan Borough of Barnsley (Coniston Avenue, Keswick Road and Grasmere Crescent, Staincross) (Temporary Prohibition of Through Traffic) Order 1991.
