BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

The Birmingham City Council (Off-street Parking Places) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1991 Part I (City Centre)

Notice is hereby given that the Birmingham City Council, in exercise of the powers contained in section 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to this Act and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police of the West Midlands, in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, give notice of the intention to make the above Order, the effect of which will be to introduce a method of charging for the parking of motor vehicles, as defined in the Order, by way of pay and display apparatus on a car park to be provided at Charlotte Street, City.

The charge shall not apply to the holders of badges issued to registered disabled people or to invalid carriages or vehicles issued to disabled persons in lieu of an invalid carriage.

Motor cycles, motor cars and invalid carriages as defined in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and motor vehicles constructed or adapted solely for the purpose of carrying goods but not exceeding 30 cwt. unladen weight.

The Borough of Bournemouth (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1981 (Variation) (No. 7) Order 1991

The Borough of Bournemouth (Street Parking Places) Order 1991 (Variation) (No. 4) 1991

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Bournemouth (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the County Council of Dorset (hereinafter referred to as "the County Council") in exercise of the powers of the County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, intend to make the above Order.

When the Order is effective, the restrictions listed in the Schedule to this notice will apply.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purpose, of picking up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods and, where necessary, in connection with the maintenance of roads and the supply of gas, electricity and water, unless specifically stated otherwise.

A map showing the restricted areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at:

- (i) The Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Bournemouth, on Mondays to Fridays between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- (ii) The branch libraries in the areas that the affected roads are situated.
