THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Lower Rhymney Valley Relief Road) (Route A469, Cardiff to Llechryd Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1990.

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed (with modifications) the above Order which was made by the County Council of Mid Glamorgan under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
- (b) to stop up highways;
- (c) to construct new highways;
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises; and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council are proposing to construct between Pwll-y-Pant, Caerphilly and Ystrad Mynach.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been compiled with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 5th September 1991, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
