Mid Glamorgan County Council (Brecon Road and Gwaelodygarth Road, Merthyr Tydfil) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd September 1991 the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on:

- (i) both sides of Brecon Road (Route A470), Merthyr Tydfil from a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 46-47 Grawen, north-westwards for a distance of 40 metres (44 yards);
- (ii) both sides of Gwaelodygarth Road, Merthyr Tydfil from its junction with Brecon Road (Route A470) north-eastwards for a distance of 15 metres (16 yards).

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable medical practitioners and veterinary surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the length of roads, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The Order came into operation on 5th September 1991 and a copy thereof and a map showing the lengths of roads to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 5th September 1991.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 5th September 1991, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Mid Glamorgan County Council (Unnamed Road from High Street to Station Road, Hirwaun) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd September 1991 the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on both sides of the unnamed road between High Street and Station Road, Hirwaun, at the rear of Nos. 35-41 High Street from its junction with High Street in a northerly direction to its junction with Station Road, a distance of approximately 76 metres (83 yards).

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable medical practitioners and veterinary surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the length of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.
