*The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Dennis Place, Bryncethin)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991*

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd September 1991, the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on both sides of Dennis Place, Bryncethin from its junction with the unnamed road forming part of route A4061 in an easterly direction for a distance of 15 metres (16 yards).
