Edingale-Harlaston Road, Edingale, from its junction with Main Road in a sourtherly direction for a distance of 100 metres.

Pessall Lane, Edingale, from its junction with Croxall Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 130 metres.

Raddle Lane, Edingale, from its junction with the Edingale to Croxall Road in a northerly direction for a distance of 80 metres.

The Suffolk County Council (Parish of Leiston) (Various Roads) Prohibition of Waiting and Loading, Revocation Consolidation) Order 1991

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to board or alight; goods to be loaded or unloaded, except as in (b) above; for building, industrial or demolition works; for the maintenance of the road or the services therein; and for certain other purposes specified in the Order. There are also the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles, except
