Eldon Deep Rights of Way Application 1991

Notice is hereby given that the British Coal Opencast, in connection with the working of coal by opencast operations, propose to apply under section 15 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958, to the Secretary of State for an Order suspending non-vehicular rights of way as described in the Schedule below.

2. Opencast planning permission for the working has been applied for.

4. An alternative right of way for use by the public during the period for which the Order will be in force will be made available as described in the Schedule below.

Written objections stating the grounds on which objections are made may be sent by any person to the Secretary of State before 11th October 1991 at the Department of the Environment, Room C16/21, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB. If Sedgfield District Council or Durham County Council, in whose area any part of the rights of way lie, objects and do not withdraw their objection the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry; if any other person objects and does not withdraw his objection he may arrange a public inquiry if he thinks fit.
