Notice of application for a licence to abstract water

CLEVELAND COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of Cleveland (A171/A173, Guisborough) (De-restriction) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Cleveland with the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport have made an Order under sections 82(3) and 83(2) and 83(3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

1. That length of the A173 from a point approximately 70 metres south its junction with Blind Lane to a point approximately 120 metres north of its junction with C110 Stokesley Road, a distance of approximately 400 metres.

2. That length of the A171 from a point approximately 160 metres east to a point approximately 160 metres west of the centrepoint of the A171/A173 roundabout, a distance of approximately 320 metres.

3. That length of the A171 from a point approximately 300 metres west to a point approximately 270 metres east of the centrepoint of Woodhouse roundabout, a distance of approximately 570 metres.
