PLANNING (LISTED BUILDINGS AND CONSERVATION AREAS) ACT 1990

Designation of Conservation Area—Exeter Road/The Watercourse, Newmarket

Notice is hereby given that the Forest Heath District Council, by Resolution dated 24th July 1991, pursuant to section 70 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, has designated the area specified in the Schedule hereto as a Conservation Area. A plan of the Exeter Road/The Watercourse, Newmarket Conservation Area may be inspected during normal office hours at both the District Offices, College Heath Road, Mildenhall and the Forest Heath District Council Information Centre, The Rookery, Newmarket.

The purpose of the designation is to preserve and enhance the character and appearance of an area which is of special architectural or historic interest and to ensure that special regard is paid to the architectural and visual qualities of the Conservation Area when proposals for development are under consideration.

The principal effects of the designation are that, under the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990, with certain exceptions, no building within the Conservation Area may be demolished without the consent of the District Council and that, under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, owners wishing to do work to trees must give 6 weeks written notice of their intention to the District Council which may decide to make a Tree Preservation Order. Where such an Order is already in force an application for consent is required. Permitted development rights, which for certain classes of development are narrower in Conservation Areas, are contained within the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1988.
