Notice of application for a Licence to obstruct or impede the flow of an inland water by means of impounding works and to abstract water

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the National Rivers Authority, Anglian Region, by Taylor Farms, Hall Farm, Herringswell, for a combined licence to obstruct or impede the flow of water courses and side channel to the Tuddenham Mill Stream by means of the existing weir at National Grid Ref. TL 7315 7165 in the Parish of Tuddenham in the District of Forest Heath, in the county of Suffolk and to abstract 230,000 cubic metres of water between November and the March following from the said Inland Water at or near that point. The water is required for winter filling of a storage reservoir for summer irrigation.
