If the District Council or County Council in whose area any part of the right of way lies objects and do not withdraw their objection the Secretary of State must arrange a public inquiry; if any other person objects and does not withdraw his objection he may arrange a public inquiry if he thinks fit.

#### *Rights of Way to be Suspended*

1. Part of claimed footpath No. 3 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point north-east of Fenton Industrial Estate in a generally north-easterly direction to a point on Eaton Park public open space area, being that part which runs from a point 45 metres north-east of Fenton Industrial Estate for about 220 metres to a point about 45 metres south-west of Slapton Close, Eaton Park.
2. Part of claimed footpath No. 4 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point north-east of Fenton Industrial Estate in a generally east-north-easterly direction to a point approximately 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, being that part which runs from a point 50 metres north-east of Fenton Industrial Estate for about 490 metres to a point at its termination about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park.

Part of claimed footpath No. 6 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point at the termination point of claimed footpath No. 4 generally northwards towards the Eaton Park public open space area, being that part which runs from a point about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park for about 30 metres, to a point about 55 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park.
5. Part of claimed footpath No. 7 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point at the southern end of Arbourfield Drive, in a generally south-westerly direction to a point about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, being that part which runs from a point 55 metres south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park for about 45 metres to a point about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park.
6. Claimed footpath No. 8 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point 205 metres south-south-east of Fenton Industrial Estate in a generally north-easterly direction for about 625 metres to a point on claimed footpath No. 9 about 200 metres south-south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park.
7. Claimed footpath No. 9 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park in a generally south-easterly direction for about 355 metres to a point on footpath No. 13 about 420 metres south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park.
8. Claimed footpath No. 10 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point about 85 metres south of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, in a generally south-easterly direction for about 410 metres to a point on footpath No. 13 about 400 metres west-south-west of the Wadebridge Road, Berryhill.
9. Claimed footpath No. 11 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point about 350 metres south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, in a generally easterly direction for about 160 metres to a point about 440 metres west-south-west of Wadebridge Road, Berryhill.
10. Part of claimed footpath No. 12 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point on claimed footpath No. 10 about 375 metres south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, in a generally easterly direction to a point about 325 metres west-south-west of Wadebridge Road, Berryhill, being that part which runs from a point about 375 metres south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, for about 50 metres to a point about 350 metres west-south-west of Wadebridge Road, Berryhill.
11. Part of claimed footpath No. 13 in the City of Stoke-on-Trent which runs from a point about 435 metres south-south-east of William Birch Court, Eaton Park, in a generally north-easterly direction to a point about 300 metres west-south-west of
