(3) Revoke part of 'The Leicestershire County Council (Various Streets, Oakham) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1985' insofar as it relates to John Street (north-east side) from a point 4 metres north-west of its junction with New Street in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 44 metres.
