HIGHWAYS ACT 1990

The M62 Motorway (Widening between Junctions 14-17) (Side Roads) Order 199

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes in relation to part of the M62 Motorway, Junctions 14 to 17 which is situated between the Metropolitan Borough of Bury and the City of Salford to make an Order under section 18 of the Highways Act 1980 and all enabling powers which will:

- (a) Authorise him:
- (i) to carry out the improvement of highways,

- (ii) to stop-up highways, and
- (iii) to construct new highways

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the above-mentioned part of the said motorway, and

- (b) provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the highway authority specified in the Order as from the date on which he notifies that authority that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Any person may not later than 18th November 1991, or within 8 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, if such period should expire later, object to the making of the Order, by notice to the Secretary of State at the address of the Department of Transport, North West Construction Programme Division, Sunley Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE, quoting ref. No. CNW/462/13/1/14 and stating the grounds of objection.
