Notice is hereby given, in accordance with section 113 and Schedule 12(1) of the Water Act 1989, that an application has been made to National Rivers Authority, Wessex Region, by Wessex Water Services Ltd. for consent to discharge screened sewage in an emergency to a tributary of the River Isle at National Grid Reference ST 3998 2212 from Hambridge Pumping Station, Hambridge, Curry Rivel.

The pumping station is part of a new sewerage scheme for Westport and Hambridge. As part of the scheme sewage will be pumped to Ilminister Sewage Treatment Works for treatment and disposal. The discharge would only occur in an emergency when all pumps fail due to electrical or mechanical failure and the retention sump capacity is exceeded.
