HARBOURS ACT 1964

City Council of Bristol

Notice is hereby given that the City Council of Bristol ("the Council") and First Corporate Shipping Limited ("the Company") have applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to make a Harbour Revision Order under section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The objects of the proposed Order are to designate the Company as the harbour authority for the port of Bristol (other than the City Docks and the Portishead Docks) in place of the Council (which will remain as harbour authority for those Docks) and, in consequence thereof, to confer upon the Company certain of the statutory functions hitherto exercised by the Council in respect of the Port of Bristol.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

CAMBRIDGESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cambridgeshire (Mill Street, Gamlingay) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 199

Notice is hereby given that, Cambridgeshire County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police, the effect of which will be to limit waiting to 30 minutes in any hour between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday on the west side of Mill Street from the end of the existing double yellow lines outside the newsagents shop southwards up to and including the frontage of No. 10 Mill Street.

The standard exemptions covering loading and unloading, boarding and alighting, emergency service vehicles and disabled persons vehicles will apply.

A copy of the proposed Order, a map and a statement of the reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be inspected at the office of the undersigned during normal office hours.

Objections to the proposal, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent in writing to reach the undersigned by 18th October 1991, quoting ref. RDP/G440/87.

The proposed Order will also make permanent the experimental prohibition of waiting introduced in Mill Street in September 1990 as part of the traffic calming scheme in Mill Street and Waresley Road.

DURHAM COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Durham (Borough of Darlington) (Whinbush Way) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1991
