HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The County Council of Avon (Avon Ring Road Stage 1B(ii)) (A4174 Classified Road) (Side Roads and other works) Order 1990

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above Order which was made by the County Council of Avon under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 and which, as confirmed, provides for authorising the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
- (b) to stop up highways,
- (c) to construct new highways,
- (d) to stop up private means of access to premises and
- (e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council are proposing to construct between Westerleigh Road and Pophrey Hill.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 27th September 1991, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
