- (a) prohibit waiting at all times in part of Lode Street;
- (b) prohibit waiting and both waiting and loading and unloading at all times in parts of High Street;
- (c) impose a one-way traffic flow in a westerly direction in White Hart Lane from Lode Street to High Street;
- (d) revoke existing restrictions which conflict with the Order.

Full details may be obtained from the Order.

Exemptions to the waiting restrictions allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight; goods to be loaded or unloaded (except in part of High Street); for building, industrial or demolition works, for the maintenance of the road or the services therein, and for certain other purposes specified in the Order. Licensed taxis are permitted to wait in part of High Street. There are also the usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles, apart from where taxis are permitted to wait.
