SCHEDULE TO THE ORDER

Description of the Area

Scroggs Close lies on the eastern side of the Furness peninsula, five kilometres south of Ulverston, near the coastal village of Baycliff. The notification area has four separate components due to the fragmented nature of the site. Although it has no formal conservation status at present, Scroggs Close lies within a proposed County Landscape (former Area of Great Landscape Value).

The areas of pavement lie on a small hill rising to 85 metres OD to the north-west of the village. The western edge of the area forms a prominent scar and the hill is capped by two large sloping terraces of pavement consisting of small and irregular clints. The area was formerly wooded but apart from scattered dwarfed shrub cover is now open and bare. The site forms part of a large block of pavement which comprises Scales and Baycliff Haggs, Scroggs Close and the area adjacent to Green Slacks. There are no public footpaths crossing the notification area.
