## The Borough of Stafford (Broad Street, Stafford) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1991

Notice is hereby given that, the Stafford Borough Council propose to make the above Order in exercise of their powers under sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposal will be to prohibit any vehicle from waiting, loading or unloading at any time on the south eastern side of Broad Street, Stafford, from its junction with Chapel Street to its junction with Earl Street.
