

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1990

Stopping-up of Highways at Huyton, Merseyside

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council he has made an Order under section 247 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping-up of Highways (Metropolitan Borough of Knowsley) (No. 12) Order 1991" authorising the stopping-up of a length of Burton Road and various footpaths at Hillside, Huyton.

Copies of the Order may be inspected, free of charge, on application to the office of the Department of Transport, North West (Network Management) Division, Sunley Tower, Piccadilly Plaza, Manchester M1 4BE (quoting ref. TNW 5090/35/1/26) and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the Hillside Housing Office, Hillside Avenue, Hillside, Huyton.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 13th November 1991, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

*The A6 Trunk Road (Great Glen Bypass) Order 19**The A6 Trunk Road (Great Glen Bypass) (Detrunking) Order 19 and**The A6 Trunk Road (Great Glen Bypass) (Side Roads) Order 19*

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

1. an Order under sections 10 and 41 of the Highways Act 1980 providing that a road about 4.46 kilometres in length which he proposes to construct at Great Glen, in the county of Leicestershire, from a point on the A6 Trunk Road 320 metres south-east of its junction with Gorse Lane and Mere Lane to a point 190 metres south of the access to Burton Brook Farm shall become a trunk road as from the date when the Order comes into force;
2. an Order under sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980 providing that the length of the A6 Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Leicestershire (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the road is open for through traffic; and
3. an Order under sections 12, 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him:
 - (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
 - (b) to stop up highways,
 - (c) to construct new highways,
 - (d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
 - (e) to provide new means of access to premises.

and providing for the transfer of each of the said highways to the County Council of Leicestershire as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Orders and of the relevant plans and of the Environmental Statement prepared in accordance with EEC Directive 85/337/EEC, may be inspected, free of charge, at all reasonable hours from 13th November 1991 until 13th February 1992 or within 3 months from the date of publication of this notice whichever period shall expire later, at:

In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds for objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

The proposals contained in these draft Orders replace those contained in the draft Line Order and draft Side Roads Order notice of which was given on 7th July 1972 and 21st March 1975 respectively.

Notification by a public gas supplier of intention to execute works for the construction of high-pressure pipelines

In accordance with section 20(1) of the Gas Act 1986 (c.44), the Director General of Gas Supply has received notice from British Gas Plc, a public gas supplier within the meaning of that Act, of its intention to execute works for the construction of a high-pressure pipeline for the conveyance of Natural Gas or Substitute Natural Gas, as follows:

Copies of the notice, and of the accompanying map delineating the route which the proposed pipeline is to take, may be inspected, free of charge, between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday to Friday, in the Library of the Office of Gas Supply, Southside, 105 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QT (telephone 071-828 0898 for an appointment). Copies may also be purchased from the Library, at a cost of £1 for up to and including five pages, and 10p per page thereafter (including VAT), by personal callers between the times given above, or by postal request made payable to the Office of Gas Supply.

Sections 20(4) and (5) of the Gas Act 1986 provide that the Director General of Gas Supply may give directions as to the capacity of a proposed pipeline and as to the cost of its construction, if satisfied in the light of representations:

- (a) that a demand exists or is likely to arise for the conveyance of gas of, or of a kind similar to, the kind specified in the notice relating to a proposed pipeline; and
- (b) that the routes along which the gas will require to be conveyed will severally be, as to the whole or any part thereof, the same or substantially the same as the route so specified.

Any representations as to matters should be made in writing and delivered to the Director General of Gas Supply, Office of Gas Supply, Southside, 105 Victoria Street, London SW1E 6QT, in such manner that:

- (a) an indication in respect of the gas for the conveyance of which a demand may exist or be likely to arise, of
 - (i) its origin,
 - (ii) its quantity, and
 - (iii) the rate at which it may be conveyed,
 is delivered within 28 days of publication of this notice; and
- (b) any other and further representations are delivered within 90 days of publication. (30 SI)
