Drought Orders

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment has made the following orders:

- The Southern Water Services Limited (Smallbridge) (Drought) (No. 2) Order 1991, which came into force on 1st November 1991 and which authorises the Company to abstract water from the River Teise for storage in Bewl Water reservoir at Smallbridge, near Goudhurst, Kent, below the licensed minimum residual flow specified at Teston.
- The Southern Water Services Limited (Springfield) (Drought) (Extension) Order 1991, which came into force on 12th October 1991 and which authorises the Company to continue to abstract water for public supply from the River Medway at Springfield near Maidstone, Kent, below the licensed minimum residual flow and without the release of compensation water from Bewl Water reservoir.
- The Southern Water Services Limited (Medway Groundwater) Drought Order 1991, which came into force on 1st November 1991 and which authorises the Company to abstract water for public supply from licensed boreholes in the Faversham and Sittingbourne areas without individual restrictions as to quantities and periods.
